

**BULGUKSA TEMPLE:** Bulguksa Temple is the representative relic of Gyeongju and was designated as a World Cultural Asset by UNESCO in 1995. The beauty of the temple itself and the artistic touch of the stone relics are known throughout the world.

Bulguksa underwent numerous renovations from the Goryeo Dynasty (918-1392) to the Joseon Dynasty (1392-1910), but was burned down during the Imjinwaeran War (the war following the Japanese Invasion, 1592-1598).

**SEOKGURAM GROTTO:** The official name of Seokguram, National Treasure No. 24, is Seokguram Seokgul. Designated as World Cultural Heritage Site by UNESCO in 1995, it is an artificial stone temple made of granite. The construction started with Kim Dae-Seong (700~774) in 751 during the reign of King Gyeong-Deok (742~765) of the Silla Dynasty (57 B.C.~A.D. 935) and it was finished twenty-four years later in 774, during the reign of King Hye-Gong (765~780).

Located on Dongbaekseom Island, which is noted for its beautiful, natural landscape accented by dense camellia and pine trees, Nurimaru APEC House has been used as a memorial hall and a prestigious international conference hall since the APEC summit meeting. Nurimaru, a 3-story building, is a modernistic expression of "jeongja," a pavilion in traditional Korean architectural style. Its roof shape symbolizes the ridgeline of Dongbaekseom Island. Its interior design is a visual display of Korea's creative traditional culture.

The Busan Aquarium contains over 35,000 species of fish, algae, reptiles, and amphibians. This state-of-the-art facility is one of Korea's top aquariums. The aquarium covers an area of 36,000 m2 and is spread over 3 underground levels and features an outdoor park. On the first underground level is a souvenir shop and several places to eat, while the B2 and B3 levels showcase the various exhibits. The third underground level boasts an 80m main (seabed) tunnel.

Beomeosa Temple is located at the edge of Mt. Geumjeongsan, a famous mountain in Busan. About 1,300 years ago it was constructed by monk Ui Sang in the 18th year (678) of King Munmu (reign 661~681) of the Silla Kingdom (the kingdom mainly occupied the Gyeongsang-do Province region in 678A.D.). In the geography book 'Donggukyeojiseungram' the origin of Beomeosa Temple is written as follows: "There is a well on the top of Mt. Geumjeongsan and the water of that well is gold. The golden fish in the well rode the colorful clouds and came down from the sky. This is why the mountain is named Geumsaem (gold well) and the temple is named 'fish from heaven'."

# **Slovenia Fleet**





You are kindly invited to the **Carniola Rotary Regatta** from Saturday, 28th May, to Tuesday, 31st May 2016, which will take place on the route **SPLIT – ŠOLTA – VIS – HVAR – SPLIT**.

We are certain that you would like to sail with your friends, and that together we can withstand the blue, the smell and the taste of the sea, and wind in the sails, as well as the social networking and fun. We will be happy to welcome each and every crew member.

Until then we are sending you a kind Rotarian greeting!

#### Crews

The entrants of the competing crews are the Rotary clubs. Each club can enter one or more crews. In each crew at least one member must be a Rotarian. The crew can consist of members from different Rotary clubs; in this case they must decide which will be the running club, i.e. whose flag they would compete under. Individual Rotary club members can also apply; they will become a member of the crew on one of the sailboats.

#### Entry fee

The entry fee for each crew member is  $250 \in$  if the crew consists of at least 8 members. If there are less crew members, the whole crew has to pay additional  $50 \in (e. g., 7 \times 250 \in + 50 \in, 6 \times 250 \in + 100 \in)$ . The entry fee covers humanitarian contribution (min.50  $\in$ ), the dinners, berths in marinas and other expenses of the sailing competition. The fuel, arrival expenses and rent of the sailboat are not included in the entry fee.

There is a special offer of sailboat rental for our regatta. With application, one needs to choose the type of the sailboat. The types available are:

- 2 kom Hanse 445, 3 cabins,
- 6 kom Bavaria 46, 4 cabins.

When ordering, "first-come, first-served" system will be applied. The Bavaria 46 and Hanse 445 rentals cost 1,500 €.

The price includes:

- Sailboat rental from 28<sup>th</sup> to 31<sup>st</sup> May 2016
- Transit log
- Cleaning
- Parking

The deposit is not included in the price above. It is paid at the takeover of the sailboat.

The remaining funds of the entry fees are intended for the humanitarian purposes. The regatta is regulated by the ISAF rules from 2009, the regatta advertisement, and the International Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea (the regulations for coastal waterways competitions). The sailing boats will be sorted into two competition classes (according to the sailboat type – Hanse 445 and Bavaria 46). Teams from both categories will be awarded.
